Ordinance No. 2017-01 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WALTON, KENTUCKY,
CREATING CHAPTER 92A OF THE WALTON CODE OF ORDINANCES PROHIBITING
PUBLIC NUISANCES AS DEFINED THEREIN, PROVIDING FOR THE ABATEMENT
THEREOF, PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF AND

Cardinal Engineering: Discussed High Street Bridge, would like to set up a meeting between
the Mayor and Council to review the proposed budget, the available options for the bridge, and
the proposed bidding/construction schedule. Street projects- Rachel Ann Dr. and Haley Ln, last
year \$266,980 of repairs that could be done on Rachel and Haley. These two areas were in the
poorest condition and should be replaced.

Cardinal Engineering Cont.

Alta Vista was milled and resurfaced in 2009, and last fall there were 4 areas of significant pavement failure on the section of Alta Vista between School Rd and Park Ave. – those base repairs and resurfacing would be approximately \$72,900, concerns that the remaining pavement would not survive the milling and paving traffic as the last resurfacing only lasted 7 years. Complete pavement removal and replacement is most likely a better option, an estimated cost of \$ 112,200 for new concrete pavement- and this work would most likely las 30 years before an asphalt overlay would be applied, and 50-60 years before any replacement is required. Last fall Mr. Whitacre recommended that about \$20,000 worth of patching be done to fix potholes and eroded areas along the pavement edges, and that complete repairs would cost about \$294,000 to do the base repairs and apply a new surface. The amount of traffic has increased significantly, the road was not built to handle large trucks and heavy traffic and therefore do not believe this repair would prove durable. A complete “renewal” of School Rd is a significant project but that is what I believe to be necessary at some point tin near future. Construction of a modern roadway that will address traffic, drainage and pedestrian needs is likely a \$3 to \$ 4 million dollar project, not knowing the exact width, amount of drainage work needed, or the degree to which the sidewalk will be made ADA compliant gives the wide cost range. The project can be done in phases, Mary Grubbs and Needmore can be worked on this year and then take a look at the remainder of the road in the future. Ryan Lift Station and Force Main – Lonkard is tentatively planning on starting in the next few weeks, if weather permits.

Citizen Comments:

Margie Stewart wanted to know how citizens could get involved when it came to making decisions on Wrangler Trail or other City of Walton park projects, Mayor informed her that there were no plans in place at the time for any changes. Council Member Gabe Brown informed Miss Stewart that ideas have been discussed for City Park but no concrete plans at this time. Council Member Mike Wood informed her that citizens could get involved by attending caucus meetings. Miss Stewart also asked about the water flow on Edwards and plans to extend water line over to Panzeretta. Mayor responded with he felt the water flow issues have already been addressed and Mr. Whitacre with Cardinal Engineering confirmed that a new larger water line had already been installed to address the water flow issue.




